



Pool Rules

1A. POOL SCHEDULE:

DAILY: 12:00 PM - 9:00 PM*

WEEKDAYS (DURING SCHOOL SEASON): 4:00 PM - 9:00 PM*

*The pool may be rented for a private event from 8:00 PM – 10:00 PM. In the event of a private rental of the pool facilities, the pool will be closed at 7:45 PM. A notice will be posted at the pool entrance, as well as on the HOA's website calendar.

1B. The pool may be closed at any time due to inclement weather (rain, thunder, lightning, etc.), equipment failures, operational defects, or other unavoidable causes at the discretion of the pool manager.

1C. No person shall use the pool facility unless the pool is officially open and the lifeguards are on duty. Unauthorized persons found inside the pool area when the pool is closed will lose their pool privileges and risk prosecution for trespassing.

1D. Persons under 16 years of age must clear the pool hourly for a 10-minute period of adult swim and pool check.

2A. SUPERVISION OF CHILDREN

Parents and guardians shall be responsible for the actions of their children at all times.

2B. No adult shall supervise more than 5 children at any time. There must be 1 supervising adult for every 5 children present.

2C. The wading pool is for the use of children who have not entered the first grade. Children who have entered the first grade or higher are not permitted in the wading pool and must use the main pool. Lifeguards do not monitor the wading pool; therefore, parents or guardians **MUST** be present with their children (meaning inside the wading pool fence and within arms length of their children at all times).

2D. Children under 12 years old must be accompanied by an adult at all times while using the facilities.

2E. Children 12 to 17 years of age may remain at the pool without adult supervision; however, rule number 2A shall still apply. If the lifeguard staff deems it necessary, children 16 years of age and under may be required to pass a swim test prior to entry to the pool.

2F. Children 16 years of age and older are permitted to supervise younger children at the pool area; however, rule number 2A still applies.

3A. GUESTS

Residents shall be responsible for the actions of their guests at all times. A guest is defined as any person who is not a resident at Purcellville Ridge.

3B. A resident member with an authorized key fob must accompany guests upon entry into the facility and at all times. Said resident is required to swipe his/her key fob each time he/she allows another member or guest to enter the pool. For example, a resident who brings 2 of her kids and a guest is required to swipe her key fob 4 times to account for 4 people entering the pool. This data will be used for evaluating pool hours, lifeguard staffing, etc.

3C. The lifeguards may prohibit the admittance of guests when pool use is especially heavy (i.e., weekends and holidays).

4A. PROPER ATTIRE

Proper swim attire is necessary. No cut-off shorts are allowed.

4B. Children not fully toilet trained must wear a “swim diaper” covered by tight fitting waterproof pants at all times when in the wading pool or the main pool.

5A. HEALTH AND COUNTY REGULATIONS

No food or refreshments shall be consumed in the deck area near the pools. Food and drinks may be consumed only at the picnic tables in the designated food area. Water in plastic container is permissible, as is a baby or toddler spill proof cup. Juice boxes or juice pouches are prohibited in the wading area.

5B. Glass and metal containers of any type are prohibited in the pool and pool house area.

5C. Smoking is NOT permitted in the pool or pool house area.

5D. Persons with open lesions or sores are not permitted to use the pool.

5E. Pets are prohibited.

6A. PROPER BEHAVIOR

The lifeguard has the authority to suspend an individual's pool privileges for the day for any infraction of these rules. Subsequent action may be taken by the Board of Directors and may include revoking an individual's pool privileges for any length of time, including the remainder of the pool season.

6B. No diving is permitted in either pool.

6C. Running and roughhousing around the pool area are strictly prohibited. Game playing and the use of floats will be permitted at the discretion of the guard staff.

6D. Profane language and/or gestures are strictly prohibited. Such activities are cause for removal from the pool area at the lifeguard's discretion.

6E. Alcohol is prohibited.

6E. Music may be played without earphones at a volume that does not disturb others.

6F. No wheeled vehicles are permitted in the pool area except strollers and wheelchairs.

6G. Roller blades, skateboards and bikes are prohibited on the pool deck.

7A. POOL MANAGEMENT

Proper respect and cooperation is due the lifeguards, who are there to provide a safe and orderly operation of the pool. The pool management staff has the right and the obligation to dismiss any person(s) not obeying the aforementioned rules.

7B. Property damage caused by a resident or guest will be charged to the lot owner of record. All damages will be repaired and all outstanding payments for damage reimbursement must be resolved prior to re-admittance to the pool.

7C. Neither the Pool Manager nor the Association is responsible for lost or stolen items. The lifeguard staff will maintain a "lost and found" box in the pool office in the event they find unattended items.
